Job-specific training helps ensure that individuals working with propane do so safely, helping employers comply with regulatory requirements.



In Canada, the CSA B149.2 Propane Storage and Handling Code, stipulates that individuals who transfer propane from one container to another must be the holder of a certificate recognized by the authority having jurisdiction. In addition, provincial Occupational Health and Safety regulations require that individuals be adequately trained to perform their job functions.

The Propane Training Institute works closely with regulatory authorities, both federally and provincially, to ensure our training courses satisfy certification requirements.

National in scope

A not-for-profit industry association, the Propane Gas Association of Canada is the national voice of the propane industry. Offering training through the Propane Training Institute is one of the many ways it supports its members and their customers.

Available in English and French

Many Propane Training Institute courses are currently available in both English and French, including materials used by P-T-I certified Trainers and Examiners.

Over twenty-two thousand students annually

The Propane Training Institute issues over twenty-two thousand certificates per year to students who have successfully completed our training courses.

A network of over one thousand certified Trainers available across Canada

There are currently over one thousand active Trainers or Examiners certified by the Propane Training Institute to deliver our training courses.

Students of the Propane Training Institute demonstrate knowledge transfer by successfully completing written and practical hands-on exams.



Students gain initial knowledge of the course material by attending a training session provided by a certified P-T-I Trainer. P-T-I training courses have been designed to be delivered in one day or less. Some P-T-I courses are available in self-study format that allow the student to study the course manual and supporting video.

A certified P-T-I Trainer or Examiner will administer a written exam to the student. Upon successful completion, the student will then observe a demonstration of the skills with real equipment and be provided an opportunity to practice. The student

will then be required to successfully complete a practical hands-on exam that will demonstrate knowledge of how to apply the skills learned.

Upon successful completion of both the written and practical hands-on exam, the student will be issued a 90-day temporary authorization. This document will satisfy the certification requirements of the authority having jurisdiction until a wall certificate and a plastic wallet card is provided by the Propane Training Institute to the student.
