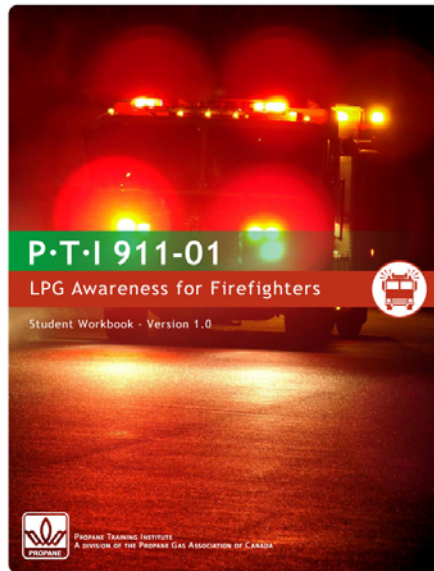

LPG AWARENESS FOR FIREFIGHTERS

COURSE TOPICS AT A GLANCE

Intro/LPG Properties: How propane and LPGs are used and shipped in Canada and the unique properties of gases shipped under UN1075.

Containers & Equipment: The safety features of the typical containers and equipment firefighters are likely to encounter.

LPG Transportation: Includes the safety features of equipment and specialized tanks used to ship LPGs by road and rail.

Emergency Response: Covers the extensive emergency planning the propane industry has in place and the role of specialized LPG emergency responders, such as PGAC's emergency response subsidiary – the LPG Emergency Response Corporation.

Emergency Response Scenarios: Includes immediate mitigation activities and real-life exercise scenarios for group interaction.

Media Relations: Provides practical "Do's and Don'ts when dealing with the media, including an interactive exercise to support the understanding of key messages related to propane and other LPGs.
